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DUI/DWI COMPLIANCE PROGRAM

BACKGROUND

- Established in 1990 as a means to monitor pilots who had alcohol-related motor vehicle violations
- Codified in Federal Aviation Regulation Parts 61 and 67 (14 CFR Parts 61 and 67)
- FAA may deny an application for, and suspend or revoke, an airman certificate or ratings if an individual has had two or more alcohol-related motor vehicle convictions **OR** state motor vehicle administrative actions within a 3-year period

MANDATORY REPORTING REQUIREMENT

- Under 14 CFR § 61.15(e), each pilot holding a certificate issued under Part 61 must provide a written report of each Motor Vehicle Action (MVA) within **60 calendar days** of the effective date of the MVA

EXAMPLES OF MVAs

- Revocation/suspension/cancellation of driver license for chemical test failure or refusal
- Administrative per se orders ("on-the-spot" license suspensions for DUI/DWI in 42 states)
- 10-day civil revocations
- Express consent revocation/suspension
- Driving While Under the Influence (DUI) or Driving While Impaired (DWI) conviction
- Driving with an unlawful blood alcohol level conviction
- Operating While Under the Influence (OWUI) conviction



WHAT NEEDS TO BE REPORTED ?

- Name, address, date of birth, and airman certificate number
- Type of violation that resulted in the conviction or administrative action
- Date of the conviction or administrative action
- State that holds the record of conviction or administrative action; and
- Statement of whether the motor vehicle action resulted from the same incident or arose out of a previously-reported motor vehicle action
- **OPTIONAL** - Driver's license number, Social Security number (if different from airman certificate number) and/or daytime telephone number

LEGALLY SPEAKING

- **14 CFR § 61.15(d)(2)** provides that if a pilot is convicted or has administrative actions as a result of separate arrests for alcohol-related MVAs within 3 years, then the pilot is subject to the provisions of 61.15(d) and may have his or her airman certificate suspended for 120 days
- When a pilot is convicted of an alcohol/drug-related MVA or receives an administrative action as a result of an MVA, the pilot **must** answer "Yes" to Question 18V on the airman medical application, and detail the facts pertaining to that action in **EXPLANATIONS**. Failure to do so may result in the suspension or revocation of all airman, ground instructor, and/or medical certificates and ratings held by that pilot. (**14 CFR § 67.403**)
- **REMEMBER**, reporting alcohol-related MVAs only on the medical application **does not satisfy 61.15**
