OPTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE FAA ECG ADMINISTRATIVE DATA SYSTEM

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) upgraded its Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, ECG Administrative Data System to an all-digital operation in October 1999.

Aviation medical examiners (AME's) joining the system must use an interpreting model of a transmitting, digital electrocardiograph (ECG) machine. Generally, current production models of Burdick Medical, Philips Medical Systems (formerly Hewlett Packard), GE Medical Systems (formerly Marquette), Mortara and Welch Allyn interpreting, transmitting, digital ECG machines are compatible with the system.

As in the past, a Senior AME has the option of using an ECG service bureau (e.g., Burdick) or a third party (another AME, hospital, laboratory, etc.), to perform and transmit the ECG exam data to the Aerospace Medical Certification Division (AMCD) in Oklahoma City.
